A Citation of Osodieme Chief (Mrs) Ebelechukwu Obiano

Born in Onitsha on 7th October 1962, Chief (Mrs.) Ebelechukwu Vickie Obiano (Osodieme) hails from Ogbunike in Oyi Local Government Area of Anambra State. She got married in 1988 to Chief Willie Obiano (Akpokuodike) the Governor of Anambra State who hails from Aguleri, Anambra East LGA of the state.

Ebelechukwu attended Lagos Premier Day School in Lagos, and Okija Community Secondary School in Anambra State, for her Secondary education. She bagged Diploma in Mass Communication at University of Lagos, Akoka, and Bachelor's Degree in History and International Studies from Lagos State University (LASU), Ojo. She later obtained an Associate Degree in real estate from Lone Star College, Houston, Texas, USA. She also attended other professional trainings in human and material management in Nigeria,

Europe and the USA.

Ebelechukwu began her career in Ikeja Hotels Plc, and worked with the Nigerian National Petroleum Corporation (NNPC) and its subsidiary National Petroleum Investment and Management Services (NAPIMS) in various capacities as catering supervisor, corporate procurement officer; material and welfare officer from November 1991 until her retirement in 2010.

Mrs. Ebelechukwu Obiano had always been involved in charity work as marriage counsellor and undertook church welfare projects long before her husband long before her husband became governor in 2014. She founded the Caring Family Enhancement Initiative (CAFÉ) a non-profit organisation on 1st August 2014, to expand her philanthropic outreach.

Through CAFÉ, Mrs Obiano has touched the lives of

many children, youth, women and men in Anambra State and beyond. She has trained and empowered over three thousand, six hundred indigent widows, women and youths in various skills under CAFÉ Skills Acquisition Training programme. She built twelve 2-Bedroom bungalows under CAFE Housing for Indigent Widows free and handed to beneficiaries; eleven CAFÉ Market Toilets to promote hygiene in rural community markets. She has also made significant contributions as facilitator of cleft care to over 50 children in Anambra by Smile Train International charity that provides free cleft repair surgery and comprehensive cleft care in over eighty-five developing countries.

In 2000 her husband's community of Aguleri conferred on her the title of Osodieme Aguleri for outstanding philanthropic services alongside her husband, Willie. In 2008 she was inducted into the-

Igwe-in-Council of the Idigo Dynasty of the ancient Aguleri Kingdom. The High Chief investiture made her the only female in the 120-year old Dynasty to be so honoured.

Ebelechukwu Obiano has also been honoured outside Anambra and Igboland: In 2005, she was conferred with the title of Erelu Atayase of Ilemoso by Oba David

Adegboyega Oyewumi (Faseemi II) Obadu of Ilemoso-Ekiti-a distinguished service recognition she got with her husband who is Otunba Atayase of Ilemoso.

For her tireless commitment to the welfare of the less privileged, Mrs Obiano has been recognised both locally and internationally. She is a United Nations Peace Ambassador, a UNICEF

WASH (Water, Sanitation and Hygiene) Ambassador. Primetime Reporters First Lady of the Year Award 2016, Most Valuable Governors' Wife Award 2017, Excellence Award 2016 by Nigerian Women of Atlanta Georgia, USA. Osodieme is today the recipient of the prestigious 2017 Zik Prize for Leadership, Humanitarian Service award.

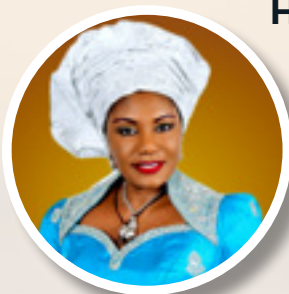

A Brief History of Anambra State Women Association of Southern California

Anambra State Women Association of Southern California (ASWASC) is a non-profit organization with philanthropic initiatives for improving living conditions, health care services, educational opportunities, nurturing cultural values, sustaining the environment and adopting technologies to inspire and empower women and children in Anambra State, Nigeria and the United States of America. Our activities and interactions are strongly rooted in our motto "UNITY IS STRENGTH". ASWASC aims at fostering unity, mutual understanding, harmony, interdependent living among all the members and with different communities in the United States of America. In addition, the association strives to preserve, uphold, and promote our cultural heritage and relationship with other organizations, exchange ideas and information in order to enhance understanding within the local community. ASWASC also engages in humanitarian, philanthropic,

charitable activities and events including but not limited to education, medicine, healthcare, environment, culture, and technology in Anambra State, Nigeria and United States of America, and among the youth within our community.

The first meeting of Anambra State women was July 18 2004 with the encouragement of members of Anambra State Men's Association for the women to form an association separate from that of the men. Prior to this time, Anambra State men and women belonged to one association. The intention of the men was to form a women wing with membership limited to those whose husbands are members of ASA-SC. However, the pioneers of ASWASC caught a vision with a broader goal of providing a platform for all Anambra State women either by birth, adoption or marriage, to come together to make a difference within our community in Nigeria and in the USA. Based on this premise, the association

sought and became an independent nonprofit public benefit corporation for charitable purposes. Mrs. Amaka Machie became the pro term President from August 2004 to February 2005, while in February 2005, Mrs. Dorothy Akpamgbo assumed leadership as the first elected President of ASWASC. ASWASC became incorporated as a nonprofit public benefit corporation and established as a 501© (3) corporation in October 2008 following her formal inauguration on August 11 2007.

During these past years, ASWASC has made tremendous stride in exponential growth in membership. The association is about 190 members strong. ASWASC is a pioneer state-based women organization in our community that has withstood the test of time. The achievements within the community as well as the impact ASWASC has made in the society continues to draw people in to become members.

ASWASC continues to make significant contributions to the community in Southern California as well as in Nigeria. Notable among these are donation of equipment to maternity wards of General Hospital Amaku Awka in August 2010 and General Hospital Onitsha in January 2017. Locally, we are engaged in an ongoing Conversation with our Daughters program, a forum that has provided opportunity for dialogue with our young daughters, as we understand their perspectives on different things as a way of "Building Bridges to a Brighter Future". Following this partnership with our daughters, the association organized a Youth Day program for young girls aged 14 to 21 in August 2015 in which we discussed Cyber safety, Health and Wellness,

Career prospects, Life Skills, Budgeting, Indigenous Igbo Culture, and hands-on cooking projects. ASWASC has also awarded scholarships to Anambra students going off to college. The association has also been involved in charitable work locally by donating to Ronald McDonald House of Charities.

As ASWASC celebrates her 10 years anniversary since inauguration, the theme becomes more apt to the vision for her future. ASWASC continues to bridge the divide between old and young adult through ongoing dialogue, project and events with the vision of a brighter future when the old will gradually relinquish the rein to the young. The successes ASWASC has achieved so far is largely due to the strength of the

bond that Onaedo women share, the pride with which we own who we are, the resources and talents members are willing to commit to the association and the able leadership the association has enjoyed over the years. Every leader that ASWASC has had, from Mrs. Amaka Machie, Mrs. Dorothy Akpamgbo., Mrs. Ngozi Onwualu, and currently, Mrs. Amaka Akudinobi, has brought a uniqueness, vision, talent and resourcefulness to make the association what it is today.
